ACTION ITEM TITLE: An amendment to Article II Section 62-28 (Personnel Allocation) for the police department

ORIGIN: Police Department

SUMMARY:

This amendment will change the wording in 62-28, Paragraph 2, subparagraph (e) in reference to the staffing of the telecommunications center.

RATIONALE:

City staff have recognized the need for additional staffing within the telecommunications center and have budgeted for these additional telecommunicators. The current ordinance stipulates the number of full-time telecommunicators that shall be employed in the center. In order to add these additional telecommunicators the current ordinance must be amended. The suggested wording will allow for the additional staffing and will not require City staff to amend the ordinance if changes are identified in the future.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 62 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE
CITY OF EDWARDSVILLE
(Police Department)

WHEREAS, the corporate authorities of the City of Edwardsville adopted an Administrative Code for the City of Edwardsville and have made revisions thereto; and

WHEREAS, the corporate authorities adopted Chapter 62 – Administration, Article II. – Departments, Section 62-19 establishing a Police Department and authorizing specific positions within the various sections of the Department; and

WHEREAS, the corporate authorities deem it to be in the best interests of the City to amend certain sections of the Codified Ordinances which regulate the number of employees assigned to the Police Department of ; and

WHEREAS, additional staffing changes are required to increase the efficient operation of the Police Department; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Edwardsville, Madison County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION 1. RECITALS. The facts and statements contained in the preamble to this ordinance are found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted as part of this Ordinance.

SECTION 62-28. AMENDMENT.

The Codified Ordinances of the City of Edwardsville, Chapter Sixty-Two – Administration Code, Article II, Section 62-28, Paragraph 2, subparagraph (e) – Telecommunications is hereby amended to read as follows:

Telecommunications. The corporate authorities shall periodically determine the number of full-time telecommunicators, and part-time telecommunicators, needed to adequately staff the communications center. Each telecommunicator shall perform the duties assigned and assume the authority delegated by law and the director of police..

Sec. 62-28. Personnel allocation.

The authority to permanently adjust the number of personnel assigned to the police department is exclusively reserved to the corporate authorities of the city and the allocation of such personnel (subject to other provisions herein) shall be as follows:

- (1) *Commissioned members and employees.* The department shall include the following members and employees:
 - a. *Director of police.* There shall be one director of police who shall be the administrative head or chief official of the department and who shall carry the rank of colonel. The director shall be responsible to the mayor and the city council for the proper administration of the police department of the city, pursuant to the statutes of the state, ordinances of the city, and the resolutions, motions and directives of the corporate authorities and shall report to the city administrator. The director shall be considered a commissioned law enforcement officer and shall have all the powers and duties legally assigned a peace officer and director of police within the city and the state. All members and employees of the department shall be subordinate to the director.
 - b. *Deputy director of police.* There shall be one deputy director of police. The position of deputy director of police shall carry the rank of major within the organizational structure of the city police department for the duration of the appointment. The appointment(s) of deputy director shall be subject to provisions of Illinois law regarding this position. The specific appointment(s) shall be subject to approval of the mayor and confirmed by the corporate authorities.
 - c. *Lieutenants.* There shall be three lieutenants of police, who shall perform the duties assigned and assume the authority delegated by law and the director.
 - d. *Sergeants.* There shall be six sergeants of police who shall perform the duties assigned and assume the authority delegated by law and the director.
 - e. *Patrol officers.* There shall be no more than 34 police patrol officers, each of whom shall perform the duties assigned and assume the authority delegated by the law and the director.
 - f. *Probationary patrol officers.* There shall be no more than two probationary police patrol officers, hired in anticipation of pending retirements/resignations, whom shall perform the duties assigned and assume the authority delegated by the law and the director.
- (2) *Non-commissioned members and employees.* The department shall include the following noncommissioned members and employees:
 - a. *Records manager.* There shall be one records manager who shall perform the duties assigned and assume the authority delegated by the law and the director.
 - b. *Office assistant I.* There shall be two office assistants I, each of whom shall perform the duties assigned and assume the authority delegated by the law and the director of police.
 - c. *Office assistant II.* There shall be one office assistant II, who shall perform the duties assigned and assume the authority delegated by the law and the director of police.
 - d. *Community services officers.*
 1. *Number of officers.* There shall be up to three community service officers, each of whom shall perform the duties assigned and assume the authority delegated by law and the director of police.

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2. *Primary duties.* The primary duties of said community service officers shall include:
- (i) Parking and traffic control.
 - A. Enforcement of any and all ordinances and statutes relative to parking regulations within those areas of the city as assigned by the director of police;
 - B. Reporting to appropriate authorities the maintenance and repair needs at any parking or other traffic control signs, devices or markings within the assigned enforcement area;
 - C. School crossing guard duties as may be assigned by the director of police or his designee;
 - D. Traffic direction and/or control whenever necessary due to the limited availability of sworn personnel, including the receipt of reports concerning minor motor vehicle crashes.
 - (ii) Administration and enforcement of certain general offense provisions not to include criminal offenses:
 - A. Any and all ordinances and statutes pertaining to property maintenance or management, but not to include those set forth in the building and housing code or the planning and zoning codes except as provided herein, or as may be assigned by the director of police in cooperation with other officials;
 - B. Ordinances and statutes pertaining to animals;
 - C. Ordinances and statutes pertaining to bill posting;
 - D. Ordinances and statutes relative to safety, sanitation and health, snow removal and vegetation growth;
 - E. Ordinances and statutes pertaining to littering.
 - (iii) Business regulations and taxation. Enforcement of certain ordinances pertaining to business regulation and taxation provided same is done with the approval of the director of police and, whenever necessary, in cooperation with other officials:
 - A. Inspections of business premises and operations to ensure compliance with licensing requirements;
 - B. The provisions of ordinances pertaining to peddlers, solicitors and transient merchants.
 - (iv) Enforcement of streets, utilities and public services ordinances. Enforcement of certain provisions of the streets, utilities and public services ordinances, provided the same is done with the approval of director of police and whenever necessary, in cooperation with other officials:
 - A. Ordinances pertaining to trees overhanging streets and sidewalks;
 - B. House numbering as required for placement on structures;

- C. Ordinances prohibiting littering within parks and otherwise regulating use of parks by permit or designated area;
 - D. Ordinances pertaining to required containers, placement and removal of garbage and refuse.
- (v) Enforcement of planning and zoning code. Enforcement of certain provisions of the planning and zoning code, provided it is done with the approval of the director of police, and when necessary, in cooperation with other officials:
 - A. Vision clearance on corner lots;
 - B. Off-street parking in front yards.
 - (vi) Enforcement of building and housing code. Enforcement of those provisions of the building and housing code pertaining to strictly prohibited street graphics.
 - (vii) Other duties. Any and all other duties as may be assigned by the director of police.
- 3. To effect the provisions of this subsection, any person or persons appointed to the position hereby established are given full power and authority to issue citations, tickets or other documentation of violation of any ordinance or statute within the corporate limits of the city and file same with the appropriate court.
 - 4. The person or persons appointed to the positions of community service officer shall not at any time carry a firearm or other deadly weapon, or effect the physical arrest of any individual, unless otherwise directed by a police officer.
- e. *Telecommunications.* ~~The corporate authorities shall periodically determine the number of~~ ~~There shall be eight~~ full-time telecommunicators, and ~~may be as many as two~~ part-time telecommunicators, ~~needed to adequately staff the communications center.~~ ~~Each telecommunicator~~ ~~each of whom~~ shall perform the duties assigned and assume the authority delegated by law and the director of police.
- (3) *Delegation of authority in compliance with law and appointed rank.* All delegations of authority made pursuant to the provisions of this section shall be in compliance with the law, and such delegations of authority by the director shall be done with relative respect for the appointed rank of the recipient whenever reasonable and appropriate.

The current ordinance stipulates the number of fire lieutenants that shall be employed in the Fire Department. In order to add these additional lieutenants the current ordinance must be amended. The suggested wording will allow for the additional staffing and will not require City staff to amend the ordinance if changes are identified in the future. Additionally, the male/female pronouns have been updated throughout the chapter and wording regarding roles of the volunteer firefighters has been updated.

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CITY CODE CHAPTER 46
OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF EDWARDSVILLE
(Personnel Allocation of Firefighters)**

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have adopted an Administrative Code for the City of Edwardsville, and have made revisions thereto,

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities adopted Chapter 46, establishing the Fire Department, and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities deem it to be in the best interests of the community to amend certain sections of the Codified Ordinances which regulate the number of firefighters for the City of Edwardsville Fire Department;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE CORPORATE AUTHORITIES OF THE CITY OF EDWARDSVILLE, MADISON COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

SECTION 1: RECITALS. The facts and statements contained in the preamble to this Ordinance are found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted as part of this Ordinance.

SECTION 2: AMENDMENT. The Codified Ordinances of the City of Edwardsville, Chapter 46 Fire Prevention and Protection, is hereby amended by inserting the underlined language and deleting the marked through language as follows:

ARTICLE II. - FIRE DEPARTMENT

Sec. 46-19. - Establishment; members and employees; compensation.

- (a) A fire department has been established in and for the city.
- (b) The department shall consist of the fire chief, a career division, comprised of active firefighters, a volunteer division, comprised of active volunteers, and fire company No. 1, a fraternal organization.
- (c) The number of firefighters shall be determined by the corporate authorities and approved through the budgeting process.
- (d) Career firefighters shall be selected pursuant to city ordinances and the Fire and Police Commissioners Act (65 ILCS 5/10-2.1-1 et seq.). Volunteer firefighters may be accepted by the city council public safety committee, upon recommendation of the fire chief.

(e) No career firefighter shall be subordinate in authority to a volunteer firefighter, unless the fire chief deems it necessary and appropriate in exigent circumstances.

(f) Compensation for members of the career division shall be as established and approved by the corporate authorities from time to time. Reimbursement for expenses incurred by members of the career division shall be based on a per call rate to be established by the fire chief, and approved by the aldermanic public safety committee. Nothing herein is intended to prevent the fire chief from approving reasonable reimbursement claims above the routine per call amounts, subject to the city purchasing ordinance.

Sec. 46-20. - Fire company No. 1.

(a) Fire company No. 1 is a fraternal, charitable organization, organized under the laws of the state. Members of company No. 1 are not required to be active members of the career division or volunteer division of the department.

(b) Career firefighters may be members of fire company No. 1, but shall not be eligible to serve as members of the volunteer division of the department, until retirement or other honorable separation from the career division.

Sec. 46-21. - General duties.

(a) The career division's general duties include fire prevention and suppression, property inspections pursuant to the International fire code, and other nationally recognized fire codes, to the extent that they may be referenced by the city Code, rescue and emergency medical services (EMS), and such other duties as the city council deems proper and necessary from time to time. The career division, with the fire chief, shall also, when appropriate, and at suitable intervals, make practice runs or practice use of fire equipment, test hydrants and water mains, and flush sewers, gutters or other places, as may be provided by the rules and regulations of the department. Firefighters shall cooperate, in pairs of teams, combining career and volunteer members, based on shift, assigned duties, or other practical relationships, for training, emergency responses, fire prevention and suppression, community service, and other duties deemed appropriate by and for the fire department.

(b) The volunteer division shall serve as an auxiliary, and shall complement the career division, but shall not serve as a replacement for the career division. Rules and regulations are to be determined and reviewed periodically by the fire chief. Members of the volunteer division shall, at all times, be ready to assist the career division at any fire alarm, and shall be and constitute a reserve force to the career division, and be ready at all times to perform their duties as volunteer firefighters. Firefighters shall cooperate, in pairs of teams, combining career and volunteer members, based on shift, assigned duties, or other practical relationships, for training, emergency responses, fire prevention and suppression, community service, and other duties deemed appropriate by and for the fire department.

(c) All career and volunteer members shall be familiar with the operation of all equipment, tools, and other materials necessary for fulfilling duties and responsibilities of the fire department.

(d) Pursuant to the terms of [section 46-31](#) herein, all career firefighters shall become licensed by the state department of public health as emergency medical technician-paramedics, and shall respond to medical situations as assigned and as circumstances reasonably dictate. Nothing herein shall be interpreted as requiring firefighters in the volunteer division to be licensed as emergency medical technicians.

(e) All other duties of the fire chief and members of the department shall be as provided by law, and the rules and regulations promulgated by the board of fire and police commissioners.

Sec. 46-22. - Fire chief; appointment and removal.

Pursuant to 65 ILCS 5/10-2.1-4, the fire chief shall be appointed by the mayor, subject to a majority approval of the city council. The chief shall serve until his/her successor is appointed, confirmed and qualified, although the city reserves the right to remove the chief from his/her position at any time, as provided by law. Any vacancy of the position may be filled at any regular meeting of the city council, in the manner provided for the original appointment.

Sec. 46-23. - Duties of the fire chief.

(a) The fire chief shall direct the administration and operation of the fire department, and abide by and enforce policies transmitted to him/her by the mayor, the city administrator or the city council. The chief shall establish such other policies, directives, rules and regulations for the administration and operation of the department as he/she deems necessary and proper, subject to the restrictions of the Board of Fire and Police Commissioners Act (65 ILCS 5/10-2.1-1 et seq.) and other applicable law.

(b) The chief is authorized to delegate authority within the department as he/she deems necessary. Such delegation shall be in compliance with law, and shall be done with relative respect to the appointed rank of the recipient, whenever reasonable and appropriate.

(c) The chief shall ensure that all departmental rules, regulations, policies, standard operating procedures, general and special orders and directives are consistent with city ordinances, state statutes, and any applicable labor agreement. The chief shall further ensure that the mayor, city administrator, and members of the aldermanic public safety committee shall approve any changes to the aforementioned protocols that affect the organizational structure, administrative responsibilities or personnel management of the department. Nothing herein is intended to require the chief to seek approval of changes regarding those matters that are strictly operational in nature.

Sec. 46-24. - Acting chief.

In case of the temporary absence or disability of the fire chief, the mayor may appoint some competent member of the fire department, who, during such absence, shall possess the powers and exercise the duties of the chief.

Sec. 46-25. - Records of chief; annual report.

The fire chief, shall ensure that a full and accurate record is kept of all property placed in his/her charge or custody. The chief shall, at the close of each fiscal year, make a written report to the city council showing the condition of the fire department under his/her management, together with a complete list of all fires occurring in the city during the preceding year, the dates, location and nature of each fire, loss incurred thereby, and any and all such information that he/she deems important to the city.

Sec. 46-26. - Personnel allocation.

The authority to adjust the number of personnel assigned to the fire department is exclusively reserved to the corporate authorities adopting the fiscal year budget of the city.

(1)

The number of such positions, the compensation, and the number of scheduled working hours shall be established by the corporate authorities from time to time.

(2)

The persons appointed to such positions shall be responsible to the fire chief and/or the fire chief's designee.

(3)

The fire chief shall create teams, combining career and volunteer members, based on shift, assigned duties, or other practical relationships, for training, emergency responses, fire prevention and suppression, community service, and other duties deemed appropriate by and for the fire department.

Sec. 46-27. - Response to fires outside city pursuant to mutual aid agreements.

(a) The fire chief is hereby authorized to make runs outside the city limits in response to a call for assistance in the suppression of fire or emergency medical services.

(b) The fire chief is authorized to ask for assistance from any outside municipality, when, in his/her discretion, he/she is of the opinion that such assistance is necessary to preserve property or life within the city.

(c) In all cases wherein the chief calls for assistance as provided in subsection (b) of this section, in the event of a lawsuit for injury to the person or property of any person claiming injury against the fire department of the responding municipality or fire protection district, the city shall hold harmless such municipality or fire protection district, provided that such liability shall apply only in the case of a municipality or fire protection district responding to such call for assistance that has a reciprocal law of this nature.

Sec. 46-28. - Response to fires outside city where no mutual aid agreement is in effect.

(a) The fire chief, or his/her designee, is authorized to direct actions and take measures deemed necessary in response to a call for assistance in suppression of a fire, when the location of the fire is outside the city limits.

(b) Wherever a response is made outside the city limits upon the request of the owner, tenant, or agent of the burning property, commercial vehicle or noncommercial vehicle, there shall be paid by the owner into the city treasury such sum as set by city council and on file with the city clerk. The sum of \$800.00 for a commercial vehicle and the sum of \$150.00 for a noncommercial vehicle shall be paid to the city treasury for a response to a vehicle fire.

(c) The response outside the city limits upon request constitutes an acceptance of such offer and approval of such fee. Any person directing a call for assistance shall be considered and designated as the agent for the tenant or property owner.

(d) The fees provided for in subsection (b) of this section shall not apply, and shall be waived, when response is made pursuant to a mutual aid agreement.

Sec. 46-30. - Training requirements.

(a) The fire chief and all firefighters shall at all times be in compliance with applicable provisions of the Illinois Fire Protection Training Act (50 ILCS 740/1 et seq.).

(b) Before an individual may commence regular, nonprobationary, full-time employment as a career firefighter, he/she must be qualified as follows:

(1) Certification by the state fire marshal as a basic firefighter, as having successfully completed an approved training course as provided in the Act; and

(2) Licensing by the state department of public health as an emergency medical technician-paramedic.

(c) With the consent of the fire chief, and with proof of appropriate licensing and training, a firefighter may use and take away for the purpose of practice of any kind, or in order to go to any firefighter's tournament, contest, gathering or exhibition, any part or portion of the fire equipment of the city that can be temporarily spared from service.

(d) All members of the career and volunteer divisions shall be subject to reasonable, appropriate, and applicable training requirements as established by the fire chief.

SECTION 3: SEVERABILITY. Each section and each part of each section of this Codified Ordinance is hereby declared to be an independent section of part of a section, and if any such section or part of a section, or any provision thereof is held to be invalid, the remaining sections or parts of sections shall not be affected thereby.

SECTION 4: REPEALER. All ordinances, resolutions and parts of ordinances and resolutions in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.
