



## FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE 03.27.20

The City of Edwardsville continues to monitor updates from multiple agencies on the status of the COVID-19 outbreak. As of Friday afternoon, Illinois is reporting 34 deaths, 3,026 confirmed positive cases and 8 cases reported in Madison County. St. Clair County is reporting 15 confirmed cases, Clinton County 5, Monroe County 3 and Washington County 1. Illinois has tested 21,542 suspected COVID-19 patients.

Below is a summary of current City operations:

- The City of Edwardsville's Feed the Community Program has collected \$2,421 in cash and donated gift cards.
  - To date, the City has distributed 95 twenty-dollar gift cards to the following organizations: Faith Coalition, Neighbors in Need, Main Street Community Center, Glen-Ed Pantry, SIUE students and Edwardsville NAACP.
  - These gift cards are intended to assist residents in need. The City is accepting monetary donations to purchase gift cards from our local restaurants.
  - Checks, cash, or gift cards can be arranged by calling the City Clerk's Office at 618-692-7500. Credit cards will be accepted as well.
- A City Coalition has been created in an effort to streamline communication, and minimize oversights and duplication of efforts. The Edwardsville YMCA, the Edwardsville Public Library and Main Street Community Center are working together to help connect the needs of non-profit organizations with community resources.

- While the City of Edwardsville Parks remain closed, the walking paths and trails are available for use.
  - Parks and Recreation is handling phone calls during normal business hours.
  - **P&R will be extending postponement of programs/activities/events through April 7<sup>th</sup> in accordance with the Governor's Executive Order.**

- The playgrounds, restrooms, drinking fountains, pavilions, basketball courts, volleyball courts, and baseball/softball fields will remain closed at this time. The Madison County Transit (MCT) bicycle/walking trails remain open for public access.
- Public Works Building is **closed** to the public. Commercial inspections remain active until further notice.
- Republic Services trash pickup continues under its normal routes; however, large item pick-up services are suspended until further notice.
- Residents are strongly urged to pay extra attention to what they are using and flushing. **Do not flush anything other than toilet paper.** Products billed as “flushable” baby wipes can still create significant problems in the sewer system.
- City Hall is closed to the public but is staffed during regular business hours. City payments can be made online or in the drop box on the side of the building.
- The City Council meetings will continue to be streamed on Facebook and transmitted over ECTV Channel 993. The City will provide recordings of each meeting that will be available that can be requested from the City Clerk’s office.
- All committee and board meetings are cancelled until April 2, when the Administrative and Community Services Committee will meet at 5:30 p.m. in the Wildey Theatre, 252 N. Main St. in the auditorium. The public may attend but will be limited to a total of 10 present; citizens are urged to submit their questions and comments electronically.

- The Public Safety Building front lobby only is open to the public. Fire houses are closed to the public but staffed for emergency response.
- To minimize inherent risks to Edwardsville police officers and the public that are presented with COVID-19, some changes for reporting procedures to Edwardsville PD have been implemented. If you need police services that are non-emergency in nature, please call the Edwardsville Police Department at (618) 656-2131.

- Edwardsville Community School District 7 has announced it will keep schools closed through April 7. The following week is the scheduled spring break, effectively closing the District until **April 14**.

### **Economic Development**

The Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO) is working with partners to launch emergency assistance programs for Illinois small businesses. Information on the three programs can be found on the DCEO website at [www2.illinois.gov/dceo](http://www2.illinois.gov/dceo). The three programs introduced are as follows:

- **Hospitality Emergency Grant Program**: This is a \$14 million grant program to support working capital as well as job training, retraining, and technology to support shifts in operation.
  - Eligible applicants include bars and restaurants with a valid license to serve food or liquor and who generated revenues of less than \$1 million in 2019 and hotels with a valid license (hotels, motels, other lodging establishments) and who generated revenues of less than \$8 million in 2019.
  - Bars and restaurants that generated between \$500K and \$1M in revenue in 2019 are eligible for up to \$25,000, and bars and restaurants that generated less than \$500K in revenue in 2019 are eligible for up to \$10,000.
  - Hotels that generated less than \$8M in revenue in 2019 are eligible for up to \$50,000.
- **Illinois Small Business Emergency Loan Fund**: DCEO and the Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation (IDFPR) are establishing the Illinois Small Business Emergency Loan Fund to offer small businesses low interest loans of up to \$50,000.
  - Businesses located outside of the City of Chicago with fewer than 50 workers and less than \$3 million in revenue in 2019 will be eligible to apply.
  - Successful applicants will owe nothing for six months and will then begin making fixed payments at a below market interest rate for the remainder of a five-year loan term.
  - **Starting this Friday, March 27th, interested businesses will be able to express interest at a form that will be posted on the DCEO website.**
- **Downstate Small Business Stabilization Program**: To support small businesses in downstate and rural counties across Illinois, DCEO is repurposing \$20 million in CDBG funds to stand up the Downstate Small Business Stabilization Program.
  - This Fund will offer small businesses of up to 50 employees the opportunity to partner with their local governments to obtain grants of up to \$25,000 in working capital. Local governments can apply on behalf of businesses with 50 employees or less. Only units of local government recognized by the Illinois Constitution and able to support economic development activities on a sufficient scale are eligible to apply for Economic Development grant funding.
  - This includes cities, villages, and counties.
  - Municipalities must not be a HUD direct Entitlement community or be located in an urban county that receives "entitlement" funds.
  - **This includes, but is not limited to, Madison and St. Clair Counties and the municipalities of Springfield and Decatur.**
