


WATER SERVICE LINE IDENTIFICATION PROJECT




Do you have lead water pipes in your home? Let us help you find out.

We are compiling an inventory of water service lines in an effort to identify and replace lead pipes that may be in use for plumbing purposes in the community.

Let's start with some basic information:

WATER SERVICE LINES EXPLAINED



We have numerous properties for which the service line material is unknown. Please help us to identify the water service line material inside your building or house. These can be found where the water line enters your home near the main water shutoff valve.

POSSIBLE PIPE MATERIALS



Plastic piping: This likely will be white; it's rigid and would be connected to the water supply line with a clamp.



Copper piping: This type is the color of a copper penny.



Galvanized piping: This type of material is typically a silver-gray color. A strong magnet will cling to it.



Lead piping: This type is typically a dull silver-gray color. A strong magnet will NOT cling to it.

NEXT STEPS: PICK ANY OF THE FOLLOWING OPTIONS

- A)** Take a photo of your interior service line and email it, along with the physical property address where it was taken and your name, to: publicworks@cityofedwardsville.com
- B)** Call Public Works at 618-692-7535 and let staff know the service line material at your address.
- C)** If you are unsure of the service line material, call Public Works at 618-692-7535 and inform our staff. We will schedule an appointment to inspect the service line for you.
